The office is engaged in teaching students how to transfer the skills they are developing in the classroom and apply them to their career development process. Professional Career Development staff work with students each step of the way, from their first year of self-exploration to their last year, assisting them in obtaining a job or gaining entrance to graduate school.

The following services are available:

Job Search Assistance The office assists students in their job search by conducting mock interviews, resume/cover letter critiques, and individualized meetings to create job searching strategies.

Graduate/Professional School The office offers resources and individualized meetings to discuss graduate school programs, standardized tests, admission requirements, and timelines.

Career Advising The professional Career Development staff meets individually with students to help them through self-exploration of interests, values, personality, and strengths.

Programs Informational programs are offered throughout the academic year. Topics often include career exploration, resume writing, interviewing skills, job fair preparation, and admission to graduate/professional school.

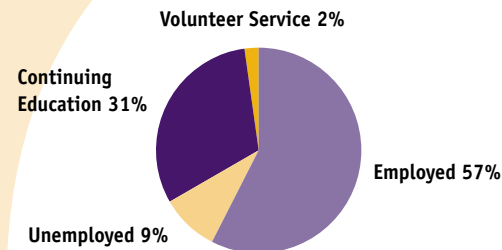

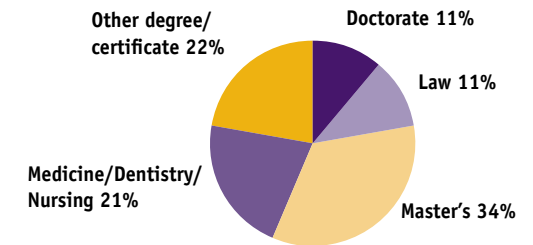
