C&RC

Proposal: C&RC approves the following temporary policy: All students who receive a zero (0.0) for Fall 2020 will have that grade converted to an NC unless they opt to keep the zero.

Rationale: This policy is both compassionate and consistent with our offering of a late credit/no credit option as a response to the pandemic. It is also consistent with CRC's policy regarding Spring 2020 grades. By making a NC grade the default in place of a zero, we help first-generation and underrepresented students who might otherwise be less likely to opt in to the NC option due to unfamiliarity with college procedures.

III SCHOLARLY AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

Mark Bollman's (Mathematics and Computer Science) book, Mathematics of Casino Carnival Games, was published by CRC Press/Routledge.

Additionally, Mark has signed a contract with CRC/Routledge for his fourth book on gaming mathematics. "Mathematics of the Big Four Casino Table Games" will appear in the fall 2021.

Joseph Ho's (History) conference panel, "Between Frames: Transnational Identities, Local Imaginations, and Visual Politics in 20th-Century East Asia" has been accepted for ASIANetwork's 2021 Annual Conference, to be held in virtual format between April 16-18.

Joseph will present a paper entitled "Crossing Borders in Fragmented Images: Missionary Photographs and Visual Circulation in Interwar North China and Colonial Korea."

On November 3, Joseph presented a podcast-style lecture entitled "Aim High, the Bookshelf Test, and Other Tips on Publishing" for a research and writing group in Sino-Christian studies, organized by Prof. Naomi Thurston at the Chinese University of Hong Kong.
