## THINGS YOU MAY NEED:

- Chargers, devices, HDMI cord
- Cleaning supplies: all purpose cleaner, sponges, broom, dustpan, etc.
- Clothes and shoes: be sure to bring winter gear and at least one set of business casual clothes.
- Extra long twin size bedding
- Lamps, fans, microwave, mini fridge
- Laundry basket & laundry detergent
- One set of silverware and a few bowls/plates
- Personal care items: toothbrush, soap, etc.
- Robe and shower caddy
- Shower sandals & towels
- Snacks
- Storage: plastic bins or small shelves

## IF YOU HAVE A KITCHEN AND/OR BATHROOM:

- Cleaning supplies for a bathroom and kitchen
- Food
- Kitchen utensils, spoons, spatulas, etc.
- Plates, bowls, cups, silverware, etc.
- Pots, pans, toaster, blender
- Toilet paper, paper towel, napkins, rags
- Trash bags, trash bin
- Wipes, cleaner, sponges

# WHAT NOT TO BRING:

## Prohibited Items:

- Drug-related paraphernalia (e.g., bong, pipe, vaporizers), water pipes (hookahs)
- Humidifiers
- Self-adhesive/string lights (including LEDs)
- Adhesive materials that are not 3M products
- Extension cords; a power strip with a circuit breaker is allowed
- Wireless/network technology (routers, wifi extenders)
- Locks, latches, or similar devices not installed by the college
- Mercury thermometers
- Natural, cut trees, branches and/or greens (such as holiday trees, wreaths and garlands)
- Vent covers

## Pets:

- The only pets permitted are fish held in tanks with a capacity of 10 gallons or less

## Weapons:

- Firearms, fireworks, explosives and ammunition
- Guns, BB guns, or other replica weapons
- Mace
- Knives with a blade longer than 3in; permitted in apartments or spaces with a kitchen
- Hazardous chemical (pesticide, pepper spray/mace, liquid fuel)

## Items that are a fire hazard:

- Candles, incense, and candle/oil warmers
- Sun lamps
- Halogen lamps, bulbs (all types, including clip-on, torchiere, desk, and spider lamps)
- Indoor and outdoor grills
- Space heaters
- Lithium batteries
- Oil-based appliances (i.e. popcorn poppers, deep frying appliances/devices)
- Flammable items, such as fuel (propane, lamp oil, solvents, lava lamps, gasoline, etc.)

## Electrical appliances:

- Air conditioners unless there is documented need approved by the college
- Appliances without an automatic shut off (e.g., slow cookers, crockpots, Instantpots, rice cookers, waffle and s'mores makers, electric kettles, coffee makers)
- Oil-based appliances (i.e. popcorn poppers, deep frying appliances/devices)
- Microwaves exceeding 600 watts;
- Refrigerators exceeding 3.5 cubic feet or exceeding 1.4 amps.
- Electric appliance with an open heating coil (space heaters, toasters, etc.)
